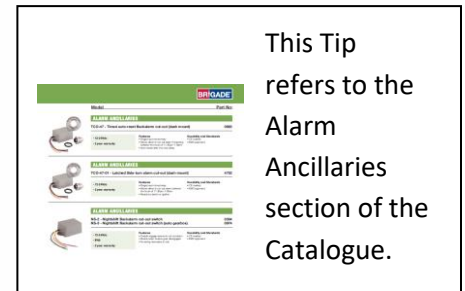

Alarm – How to switch off an Alarm at night

Related Products - All Brigade Reversing and Warning Alarms

If an Alarm requires to be switched off in urban areas at night, typically between the hours of 11:30pm – 7:00am, there are a couple of Brigade ancillary products that can be used.

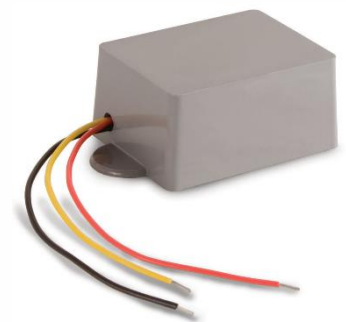


TCO-47 & TCO-47-01 allows the driver to cut-out the alarm by a button.

- The TCO-47 is a single press timed relay that auto-resets after a 3-4 minute delay or ignition cycle.
- The TCO-47-01 is a single pressed latched relay that resets with another button press or ignition cycle.

NS-2 & NS-3 are activated by double engaging reverse to cut-out the alarm. They reset when the reverse gear is disengaged.

- The NS-2 must be double engaged within approx 2 secs typically used for a manual gearbox.
- NS-3 must be double engaged within approx 3 secs typically used is for an automatic gearbox.



Brigade also produce alarms which have a built-in cut-out or sound reduction function, which are activated by double engaging the reverse gear. These products can be identified by the letters (NS) Nighshift™ or Nightsilent™ in the model number. Please see the Brigade website for the full range - www.brigade-electronics.com
